
Greetings Nebraska Region,


- The committee has initiated research on newspapers within the Nebraska region. This research aims to identify potential opportunities for advertisements or listings for the phonenumber in local communities. To ensure real-time accuracy of meeting information, the project recommends using the phone number in newspaper ads instead of meeting lists.

  - Fremont



For the mass mailing we needed to pause before proceeding any further. Free mail chimp will not work for us at this time. It limits us to 500 emails. At that point we paused to look at other options. The list we have for mailings is a couple for thousand people. Who do you send first? where do you focus? These questions needed to be answered before proceeding. Here's the options:

- Mailchimp: Purchase the bigger program. 5, 000 emails: \$75-100/ month / 10,000 emails: \$101 – 135/ month. Note this email program could be utilized in multiple ways, PR/ H&I / Convention announcements, ETC.

The plug in would be \$79/year and the webmaster would install and could give members access as needed to utilize it. - **The first ONLINE phonline training will be August 3<sup>rd</sup> 10:00 AM** via Zoom. Any interested member may join this meeting to be trained. It up to each area what your requirements will be for being a phonline volunteer.
- We are still searching for a phonline coordinator within the regional PR subcommittee to be responsible to maintain the volunteers within the phonline platform and act as a liaison & point of accountability to the areas for phonline volunteer coordination.

*Fremont Public Relations - Report to Region Public Relations (07-13-24)*

*Two of our subcommittee members recently met with Brandon Jerred. He is the Dodge County Drug Court Coordinator/Reporting Center Coordinator for District 6 Probation. We left him with 23 information packets that will cover Dodge, Washington, and Burt Counties. He said he will also give information packets to the Juvenile Probation Officers. Just a note of encouragement, he was very helpful and open minded.*

*So, with this last update meeting, we have distributed 66 information packets. We have collected 17 Network Contact Sheets. There were pull-tab flyers and a letter from NRSC/PR, about the new Nebraska phone numbers, in the packets.*

*With this meeting, we have covered most of the counties that we have meetings in. We still have to contact and meet with District 5. This is important to us because we have had meetings in Wahoo in the past. We also have a H&I meeting at the Saunders County Jail. Years ago, we asked Lincoln about servicing Wahoo, and they said we could because their area coverage was big enough.*

*We have sent 7 emails for clarification and looking for interest in having a presentation/update. Two have produced results. The first one was completed on July 02 at Carlson Counseling Services. The second is still pending because of their busy schedule. Also, we have to get back with Lotus Behavioral Health for a presentation. There was contact made in May, but again they got too busy to meet with us. The contact person was excited to meet with us and has the possibility to have 15 others there.*

*To sum this all up, we are making good progress in informing the public about Narcotics Anonymous. We still have a lot to do to get the information out to the public. I have faith that the work will get done, however, not in my timeline but the HP's.*
